Student Committee's Activities Begin - Through Special Activities -



Student committee's activities started in April.

The members of the student committee consist of students from G3 to G9 in different grades. Our student committee's activities are divided into four committees: "Executive Committee," "Environmental Beautification Committee," "Public Information Committee," and "Library Committee".

From now on, these committees will carry out regular activities once a month and constant activities during the daily school life. Taking advantage of the integrated elementary and junior high school system, activities are carried out by different grade groups across elementary and junior high schools.

At the first meeting, we elected committee chairs and discussed the vision of the school we aspire to become. We also discussed specific activities to achieve our goals. Student committee's activities are conducted as part of the "children's association activities" and "student council activities," which are positioned as special activities.



The documents that the activities written by each committee chair will be posted in the corridors.

Special activities are designed to help students solve problems in school life and create a better school by working independently and proactively in a variety of groups, while demonstrating each other's strengths and what they can do. By engaging in special activities, students learn to "build good relationships with others," "participate in groups and society and try to solve various problems independently," and "find their own challenges in groups and try to improve them. Japanese-styled education is not limited to learning academic subjects. Special activities, which include discussion activities, classroom activities, committee activities, and school events, are one of the characteristics

of Japanese-styled education. These activities are called "Tokkatsu" in Japan, are also seen in many other countries as a program for fostering children's independence, initiative, and discipline in learning.
