Environmental and International Education- Through Mangrove Planting -

Following the falconry lecture held on August 31, we held a lecture on mangrove seedling cultivation and reforestation on September 12 with the cooperation of INPEX/JODCO.

We invited Mr. Shigeyuki Baba, Professor Emeritus of Ryukyu University, to give the lecture to from G4 to G6 students. Professor Emeritus Baba has been involved in mangrove research as well as conservation and restoration activities around the world as the President of the International Mangrove Ecosystem Association. Our students listened with great interest to his talk about mangroves that can grow up to 30 meters high. They were also surprised to see the dense, hard mangrove trees sink into the water when they were placed in the water tank. After the lecture, they had the opportunity to plant mangrove seeds called Hirugidamashi. Once planted, the seeds are grown in the classrooms of G4 through G6.

During the lecture, the salinity of the Arabian Sea became a hot topic. The salinity of the Arabian Sea, which is familiar to us, is higher than that of normal sea areas (about 3.4%) due to its climate and enclosed waters. (The average salinity of the Arabian Sea is 4.5%.) Mangroves grow naturally in brackish waters where fresh water and sea water mix. The Arabian Sea, with its high salinity, is said to be a very burdensome area for mangroves. Therefore, students who have interested in mangroves after listening to the lecture started research on mangroves. The theme is "Differences in salinity and mangrove growth." They made salted water with salt concentration of 2%, 3%, 4%, and 5%, planted mangrove seeds, and observed the difference in growth from germination. The results of the experiment will be compiled and reported to him. The research laboratory is at the entrance hall of Building B in our school. You can come and see them when you visit.

By the way, some Arabian countries are aggressively working on activity for mangrove forest restoration to prevent the spread of desertification. In Abu Dhabi, many companies are planting mangrove trees in Jubail Mangrove Park, a natural park on Jubail Island. Then we are planning to visit "Jubail Mangrove Park" on 6th November to plant. We believe that this activity will help participants understand the environmental issues in the UAE, think about











the environment on a global scale, and lead to international education. The Jubail Mangrove Park also offers tree-planting experience and kayak boat experience to the visitors.
