Cultural Exchange Activities with Al Ittihad School

On Thursday, November 14, students from G1 to G3 visited Al Ittihad School for exchange activities. The main theme of this year's activities was "ECO," and the students experienced making recycled flower vases and playing "eco sugoroku" (a Japanese game of backgammon). Since the exchange has continued since last year, the students have become familiar with the program and were seen positively engaging in the activities. They also experienced UAE traditional food and traditional games, and were able to feel the desire to read the intention of what the other students were trying to say, even if they did not understand the language.





In addition, many parents were able to attend the event and experience the exchange. We would like to continue such valuable events in the future, and would like to have many more experiences that will remain in the students' hearts and minds.

G3 Spinneys Tour

On Thursday, November 7, G3 students went on a social studies field trip to Spinneys in Corniche. The manager of the store answered each student's questions in detail, and they also had the opportunity to sample seasonal apples and other foods. The other store clerks were also smiling and answered the student's questions from start to finish. The students said, "Spinney's is amazing!" "I think I know why this restaurant has an image of luxury!" They were able to gain many insights, such as "Spinneys is amazing!"

In the pre-study, some of the students were asked to translate Japanese questions into English and learn how to read them, mainly from their friends in Emirati, who are good at English.





G5 Social studies field trip

On Monday, October 28, as part of the G5 Social Studies "Our Lives and Industrial Production" study, we visited the MHI Power Middle East plant. The students were told that the company takes care of and maintains turbines, which are machines necessary for power generation. We also had the opportunity to visit a factory where they were actually working. This learning experience using all five senses was very meaningful for the students, and they were able to find answers to their questions about how industrial products are related to their daily lives. The students were also impressed by the fact that they were working not only with Japanese but also with people from various countries, and by the presence of an Emirati who told them in Japanese that he wanted to serve as a bridge between Japan and the UAE.





G4 · 6 field trip to study social studies

~Modern freshwater purification system for water supply~

On Tuesday, November 5, G4 and G6 visited "Pure water technology," a plant that produces desalinated seawater, as part of the social studies unit "Where Does Water Come From?" A total of eight containers are set up outdoors in two processes, one in the first container to purify seawater and the other in the second container to allow only fresh water to permeate through a filter. The students heard an explanation that the system will be increased in Abu Dhabi in the future to produce clean fresh water with a newly developed filter, instead of the traditional "system to produce fresh water from water vapor.

Every year, the PTA donates books to the library. Thanks to these donations, new books are lined up in the library and students are more motivated to read.
